



- 20 million adults (19%) have no formal education

- -1.6 average income earners per household



Why should we focus on indigent youth?

- · Significant proportion of Nigerians fall in the Youth Demography and are poor.
- Weak economic capability amongst the youth segment means they need more help to improve earning capabilities.
- · Quality and number of educational facilities means youth aren't learning properly.
- Leadership development and life skills are not taught as part of any school curriculum so there is a clear gap.
- Negative influences driven by areas like social media is leading to a sharp decline in the moral fibre of Nigerian youths.



## Youth Leadership Development

Through our intensive Young Leaders Mentoring Program (YLMP), we equip public secondary school students with requisite skills to achieve their goals and become change agents in the society.







We commenced our 2022 programs with the Young Leaders Mentoring Program for secondary school students.

This in-person training for indigent students was halted in 2020 due to the pandemic which stifled academic activities and the digital divide prevalent with this target group made it impossible to switch to virtual learning.

Indeed the quest for more knowledge was so evident among the 40 students we selected for our Change Champions leadership training across the 8 public senior secondary schools we adopted in Lagos State Education District II.

This intensive program also provided a platform for the 40 Change Champions to mentor their peers during the 8 weeks field work in their respective schools.

A high point at this year's program is the Vision Board session facilitated by the Corporate Sustainability and Responsibility team of Wema Bank Plc.

At the end of the program, 179 mentees emerged from the peer mentoring model.




### 19 School Prefects Emerge








### Tertiary Institution Scholarships

## Digital Literacy Program

The Digital Literacy Program is an intervention that became imperative for us to bridge the wide digital gap we experienced when our indigent beneficiaries could not switch to virtual learning opportunities during the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020.





#### DIGITAL LITERACY PROGRAM

This year, we commenced a 7-weeks basic Computer Appreciation program for students within the age range of 14-18 years old in 2 public secondary schools we adopted.

We are glad we could provide a platform for these promising Youth (95% of whom had no previous digital skills), to be digitally equipped to aid their learning and enable them thrive in today's ICT driven world.

#### STUDENTS IMPACTED

- 32 young leaders were digitally empowered (6 males, 26 females)





#### **EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT**


In addition, we provided textbooks to students in dire need, bought new school uniform and donated desks, benches, laboratory stools and tables to 2 schools.

### BACK TO SCHOOL EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

The rising inflation has greatly affected the cost of educational materials. This has had a great impact on students generally At the beginning of the new academic session in September, we embarked on our Educational Outreach to 8 of the public secondary schools we adopted supporting the educational pursuit of over 190 students by donating notebooks and pens to them.






### WORKING TOWARDS ACHIEVING UNITED NATIONS SDG 2




#### CHANGE CHAMPIONS MONTHLY WHATSAPP CHAT SERIES






